# Agriculture in Ukraine

Ukrainian agriculture is one of the most important engines of the Ukrainian economy. About 70% of Ukraine's land area is arable. In 2019, about 44.2% of export revenues (\$22.2 billion) came from agriculture. While the teaching of theoretical knowledge at agricultural colleges is generally recognised, the training in practical knowledge and skills is usually insufficient.

# The Project

The project aims to improve the quality of agricultural education in Ukraine. This should improve the career opportunities of graduates in the agricultural sector. The availability of highly qualified graduates with practical knowledge, skills and competencies is a very important key to mobilising the agricultural potential of the country. The current second phase of the FABU project will focus in particular on the further development and institutional anchoring of the previous project results.

# **Project Goals**

- Introduction of modern methods and contents as part of practical education
- Application of updated curricula/curricula and modern teaching materials at the agricultural colleges on the specialisations of crop production, animal production, veterinary medicine, agricultural engineering and electrical engineering
- Ensuring the practical relevance of education at agricultural colleges by introducing elements of dual education



The Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine approved the curricula of the five specialisations revised within the framework of the project for testing at the pilot colleges in June 2019.

#### **Results and Successes**

- The curricula were revised
- 43 teaching modules with technical content were developed
- 20 subject areas were worked on in methodology and didactics
- More than 1000 teachers at agricultural colleges received practical training and more than 300 teachers were trained in methodological-didactic issues
- Various technical papers were published and 30 technical lectures were held on the subject of "vocational training"
